Jane Kidd was born in Victoria B.C. Canada. From 1980 to 2011 she lived in Calgary Alberta and taught at the Alberta College of Art and Design. Currently she lives on Salt Spring Island in B.C. where she maintains an active studio practice. She was elected to the Royal Canadian Academy of Art in 2001 and was awarded the Alberta Craft Council Award of Excellence in 2008 and a Governor General's Award for Visual and Media Arts in 2016.

Jane Kidd's beautiful, technically demanding and conceptually rich tapestries provoke profound questions about handcraft, disciplinary knowledge and the importance of bringing historical practices into the contemporary art arena. Her ideas are expressed through symbolic images that explore the complications and contradictions of current issues, encouraging reflection on our changing world. The Northern Fibres Guild is proud to be hosting Ms. Kidd to present some of her work to a Yukon audience.
